Building Habitat For Birds: Nancy Schank introduced this month's plant, a Flowering Quince "Double Take Scarlet". It is thornless, red blooms in the spring and sometimes repeats in the summer. It is of modest size, 4-5 ft tall and wide, small birds like it, tolerates shade and is drought tolerant. It bears no fruit and rabbits like to nibble on lower branches.

Sunshine: Ginny Phillips informed us on the death of Lisa Libby's mother, and the upcoming hip surgery for Kathy Carver. Cards were passed to sign for both these members. Bev Holze is present today and improving from her knee surgery. Beth Runyan had recent shoulder surgery.
